A short but respectable entry for the first week of January, trade absolutely 'off the clock' and had to be seen to be believed! The hoggs looking £10-£15/head dearer than before Christmas. With the Brexit agreement settled and current finished trade confidence is very high amongst finishing men. We desperately need 3000 plus hoggs next week to satisfy the demand.

A shortage of strength, however still pens over £100 topping at £104.50, others to £103. All strength £92 to £100 with hoggs with condition easy to place. Several farming sorts - these seeing the biggest increase in price with the well bred types £85 to £90. Plainer types still £80 plus. Longer keeping hoggs all £70 plus with the well bred types mid to late £70's.

Several runs of Welsh hoggs - these looked very dear with several £60 plus, very few clean lambs under £60. Several ram hoggs forward topping at £104.50. Other stronger ram hoggs all £90 to £98. Farming types £82 to £89.50, some of the dearest sold were some Welsh ram hoggs with bunches of smaller farming sorts from £74 to £84, strong Welsh over £90.

Some smaller and plainer hoggs from £60 to £75, a run of small Welsh types from £44 to £54 and look very well sold.

An excellent start to 2021, we need a much larger entry for next week, vendors please take advantage of this trade. If you are thinking of selling some please contact Greg Christopher on 07770 972815.

A bigger entry today - the sale commencing with several pens of Suffolk ewes, 3's and 4's all carrying triplets lambing mid-February and making between £155 and £158. Next a nice pen of Texel ewes, yearlings to 3's carrying 1¾ lambs which made £138 with a similar pen at £128. A pen of Mule ewes, full and broken mouth scanned mainly twins and lambing to a Beltex due mid March made £132. After that a selection of ewes, various breeds mainly aged from £70 to £102.

Next week the season gets into full swing with entries of 200 Suffolk and Texel ewes, 3's and 4's scanned nearly 200% lambing mid-February to Texel rams, and 80 mainly Texel ewes scanned 176% to Texel rams due early March.

DROP AND GO POLICY FOR ALL VENDORS

No children under 16 years old will be able to attend the sales and this must be strictly adhered to as entry will be refused.

Pregnant ladies must not attend the sale.

Two metre social distancing must be observed.

Viewing will be regulated by a social distancing policy in the market and is to be permitted for registered buyers only.

Face coverings will be required in the sale ring and the yard at all times.

To facilitate the Test and Trace system, all customers/visitors will be required to sign into the market. This process will include a declaration that they have not been in contact with anyone displaying symptoms of COVID-19, nor are displaying symptoms personally.

Hand sanitiser stations will be available throughout the market; however, it is strongly recommended that both consignors and buyers have an adequate personal supply and use it regularly.
