

A much sharper trade than ever expected resulting in an SQQ of £260.6p/kg topping at 283p/kg for a pen of 38kg from Messrs T J Farrington that made £107.50/hd. A reduced entry but hardly surprising after the trades reported yesterday and combined with some last minute harvest! The trade was buoyant from the start to finish and surprisingly sharper on the 39kg to 43kg with several 270p/kg plus. The 45kg to 48kg were no dearer than last week and generally trading from £117 to £124/hd and the meated 48kg to 52kg were generally £128 to £137/hd. The very heavies 55kg plus still in good demand, topping at a phenomenal £172/hd for 76kg lambs from Messrs Pugh, Sheepcote and others over 60kg to £168, £166, £163 etc.

All in all a much better trade than expected and still well ahead of last year.

Nice size entry but a very varied show. However best ewes can still be sold to great advantage with a pen of 6 pure Texel ewes from Llanigon breaking the £200 barrier making £228, another 3 from the same home at £192. Plenty then between £154 and £176 including a penful of 15 at £166. Generally the big ewes a touch dearer but thin on the ground. Again the fatter the better, these of any breed from £130 to £155. Only one pen of Cheviots over £100 at £105 but plenty of penfuls between £80 and £90. As previously mentioned several more small and lean ewes forward but all found plenty of customers, generally £20 to £50. Given the standard of some of the sheep on offer a very respectable average of nearly £80.

Rams very few on the ground best to £156.

Why no goats? Goat keepers take advantage of the current demand.

# New Veterinary Attestation rule for farmers to be introduced on 13th December

Changes in legislation, as from 13th December 2023, will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual farm veterinary visit to allow their animals, and/or part of any animal, to be exported out of the UK. The purpose of the new rule is to comply with EU export requirements to verify the absence of notifiable disease and provide general advice on farm biosecurity.

## Why is this changing?

The Statutory Health Attestation is required from the 13 December 2023 to certify exports of POAO (Products of Animal Origin) to the EU. The EHCs (Export Health Certificates) require that the animals' farm of origin has undergone regular visits by a veterinary surgeon.

## What do producers need to do?

Producers will be required to obtain a signed declaration from their vet that the visit has taken place.

The LAA recommends that producers take steps now to obtain a signed declaration from their vet.

This should be signed and completed by the farm vet.

Obtaining a signed veterinary attestation must be done at least once over a 12-month period and can be combined with any other routine veterinary visit, including government supported initiatives such as the Animal Health and Welfare Pathway in England.

Farmers and vets must keep a copy of their completed declarations and the "unique reference number" created, for their records and to provide to their livestock auction market or meat processor.

It is expected that the sheep movement document will be updated to include a declaration that a visit has taken place, with additional space to include the "unique reference number" – We will confirm this once Defra have signed the process off. Farms that are part of qualifying assurance schemes do not need to complete the veterinary declaration. Membership of these farm assurance schemes is accepted as evidence that a premises of origin meets the requirement for regular health visits from a vet. The qualifying schemes are:

- Annual health and welfare review (England only)
- Quality Meat Scotland (QMS)
- Farm Assured Welsh Livestock Beef and Lamb Scheme (FAWL) (Welsh Lamb and Beef Producers Ltd (WLBP))
- Red Tractor

Farmer declarations can be used until 13th December.
