
A strong entry of prime lambs with a large majority of weight making up the entry, in fact 1281 lambs were all over 46kg. These lambs generally trading from 245p to 255p/kg depending upon meat, quality and breed. An overall average of 253p/kg achieved topping at 292p/kg for 41.5kg that made £121/hd from Messrs V Eaton, Strawberry Hill. The best meated 48kg to 50kg trading from 255p/kg to 270p/kg topping at £131.50/hd for 48kg lambs from Powell Partners, Upper Newton. A pen of 45kg from Messrs Dunswater Farms topping at 266p/kg.

The heavier lambs still in strong demand with the 52kg plus weights averaging £136.20/hd up to £157/hd for 63kg from Messrs Pritchard, Primrose Bank. Others at £155.50/hd (268p/kg) for 58kg from Messrs J W Rees & Son, New House. Plenty £140 to £150. A serious shortage of light lambs forward with only 200 under 39kg, the 32-39kg averaged a very pleasing 268p/kg up to 287p/kg for a pen of 37.5kg that flew to £107.50/hd from Messrs T K & S M Atkinson, Fayreways.

The same trade this time last year was 226p/kg so thankfully 26p/kg the right side!!

It had all the feeling of a sharper trade, possibly because the show had improved on last week. Not a huge amount of 'top end' forward, easily sold from £140 to £189 (twice for 9 ewes). This week bought a lot more sheep being sold between £90 and £110 whereas last week a lot of sheep changed hands at £70-£85. Good runs of North Country Mules in places up to £125 and regularly between £90-£105, very little hill breeds with the best generally over £70, lesser £40 to £60. Average up £10 at £85.15.

New Veterinary Attestation rule for farmers to be introduced on 13th December

Changes in legislation, as from 13th December 2023, will require all producers selling livestock for slaughter to have had an annual farm veterinary visit to allow their animals, and/or part of any animal, to be exported out of the UK. The purpose of the new rule is to comply with EU export requirements to verify the absence of notifiable disease and provide general advice on farm biosecurity.

Why is this changing?

The Statutory Health Attestation is required from the 13 December 2023 to certify exports of POAO (Products of Animal Origin) to the EU. The EHCs (Export Health Certificates) require that the animals' farm of origin has undergone regular visits by a veterinary surgeon.

What do producers need to do?

Producers will be required to obtain a signed declaration from their vet that the visit has taken place.

The LAA recommends that producers take steps now to obtain a signed declaration from their vet.

This should be signed and completed by the farm vet.

Obtaining a signed veterinary attestation must be done at least once over a 12-month period and can be combined with any other routine veterinary visit, including government supported initiatives such as the Animal Health and Welfare Pathway in England.

Farmers and vets must keep a copy of their completed declarations and the "unique reference number" created, for their records and to provide to their livestock auction market or meat processor.

It is expected that the sheep movement document will be updated to include a declaration that a visit has taken place, with additional space to include the "unique reference number" – We will confirm this once Defra have signed the process off. Farms that are part of qualifying assurance schemes do not need to complete the veterinary declaration. Membership of these farm assurance schemes is accepted as evidence that a premises of origin meets the requirement for regular health visits from a vet. The qualifying schemes are:

- Annual health and welfare review (England only)
- Quality Meat Scotland (QMS)
- Farm Assured Welsh Livestock Beef and Lamb Scheme (FAWL) (Welsh Lamb and Beef Producers Ltd (WLBP))
- Red Tractor

Farmer declarations can be used until 13th December.
